CELEBRATING 30 YEARS

At various points in the Old Testament, in order to acknowledge what God had done, the people set up a stone as a reminder – Jacob did it after God met with him in his sleep at Bethel for example, and Joshua did it after the people had crossed the River Jordan on dry land (Gen 28:18-19, Joshua 4:5-7). There is a subtle difference though, between this and the way we use statues nowadays to commemorate events or people from the past. On the whole the events we commemorate are definitely in the past - they may still impact our lives now, but they are usually only considered worthy of a statue when they are deemed 'historical'.

The memorials set up in the Old Testament were much simpler, and put up immediately after something had happened - with the understanding that it didn't mean the end of the story that they were part of, just a marking of significant moments along the way. So, when Samuel had overseen the beating back of the Philistines in 1 Samuel 12 he set up a stone and called it Ebenezer, which means "Up to this point the Lord has helped us" (1 Sam 7:12).

This newsletter highlights some of our 30th anniversary celebrations, including the wonderful tea party we enjoyed recently (see overleaf). There are still plenty of opportunities to join us in celebrating all that God has done over the last 30 years.

We very much want these celebrations to be in the spirit of these Old Testament memorials – looking back with gratitude, while acknowledging that this isn't the end of the story. Without a doubt the Lord has helped us. We are trusting Him to continue with us as we move forward, and we'd love you to join us for the journey ahead in whatever way you are able.
